



VOTERS ARE WORRIED POLITICAL DECISIONS ARE RESTRICTING VACCINE ACCESS

Two national polls, each surveying more than 1,000 voters in the Likely Electorate, show an overwhelming, bipartisan expectation that every American should have affordable, accessible vaccine options to protect themselves and their families.

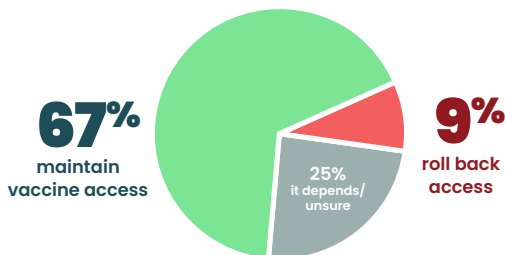
Across political leanings and demographics, the majority of voters want medical expertise to guide public health decisions. Voters are more likely to vote for Congressional candidates that support maintaining vaccine access.

Conducted by Echelon Insights, the results make clear:

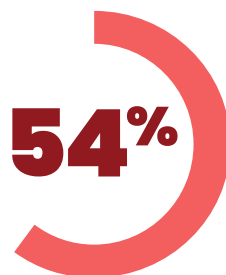
Americans are concerned that political interference and confusion around federal vaccine recommendations are making it harder for people who want protection to get it.

Voters more likely to support Congressional candidates who...

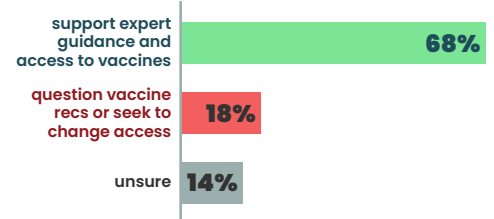


Americans overwhelmingly prefer a candidate who supports maintaining access to childhood vaccines rather than a candidate who seeks to roll back access.



Say they would be less likely to support a candidate who backs rolling back or eliminating vaccine recommendations, even if they agree with that candidate on other issues.

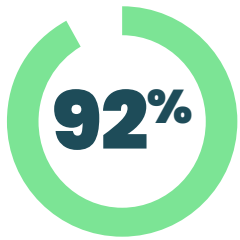
Voters believe in support for politicians who...



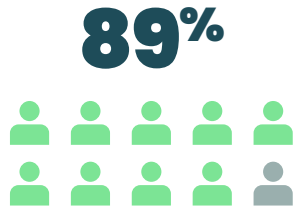
The majority of voters say that politicians who want expert guidance and access to vaccines should be supported.

TRUST IN DOCTORS

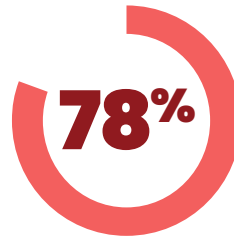


Have confidence in their doctors and family pediatricians to provide accurate guidance and information about vaccines.

Feel political influence is affecting scientific decision-making in vaccine policy.



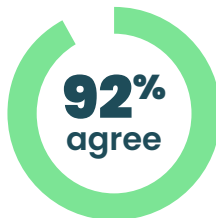
Are concerned that people who want to get vaccinated are no longer able to because of changes in — or confusion around — federal government recommendations.

WHAT AMERICA THINKS AND WANTS

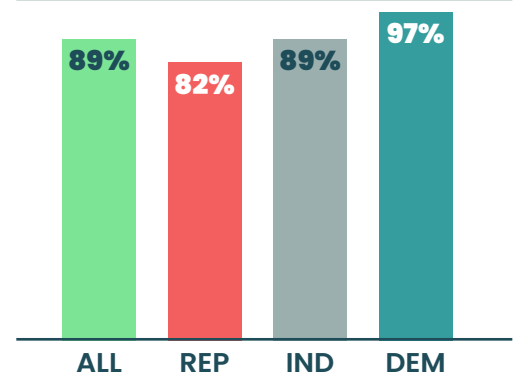
Every American should be able to protect themselves and their family with vaccines that are available, accessible, and affordable — without unnecessary barriers.
