STATEMENT A: Vaccines have played a critical role in improving public health by preventing dangerous diseases like polio and smallpox, saving millions of lives and preventing countless hospitalizations. To continue getting the benefits of vaccines, we need policies that support continued access to vaccines. Science is evolving and researchers continue to find new ways to use vaccines to fight disease – some fight diseases people already have like cancer while others prevent infection, transmission and serious illness. We should empower people with clear, transparent information to learn more about how vaccines are tested, reviewed and approved so they can make informed health decisions. Every American should be able to protect themselves and their family with vaccines that are available, accessible, and affordable without other barriers getting in the way.

STATEMENT B: Vaccines are often riskier than we are led to believe and provide less benefit than we are promised. The risks of not getting all recommended vaccines are overblown. They are used too often, in cases where they are not helpful or needed, because of pressure from the pharmaceutical industry and doctors. We should empower people to be skeptical of what is being pushed by so-called experts. And we should start by changing the childhood schedule, by not giving so many vaccines so quickly.

METHODOLOGY

Echelon Insights conducted a survey on behalf of Partnership to Fight Infectious Disease to study voters' views on vaccines. The survey was fielded online from January 27-30, 2026 in English among a sample of N=1,013 voters in the Likely Electorate (LE) nationwide using non-probability sampling. The sample was drawn from the Lucid sample exchange based on demographic quotas for registered voters in the likely electorate nationwide, and matched to the L2 voter file to verify respondents' voter registration status.

Measures taken to ensure data quality included measures to prevent duplicate responses, questions designed to disqualify inattentive respondents, and the removal of respondents from the data file who answered more than one-third of the questions they were asked in less than one-third of the median response time per question.

The sample was weighted to reflect modeled turnout and demographic characteristics of the population of voters in the 2026 likely electorate based on a probabilistic model that incorporates data from the US Census Bureau's American Community Survey and Current Population Survey Voting and Registration Supplement, as well as L2 voter file data. Weighting dimensions included gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, region, party, and voting history.

Calculated the way it would be for a random sample and adjusted to incorporate the effect of weighting, the margin of sampling error is +/- 3.4 percentage points.
